

MINUTES  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
JUNE 25, 2019

The City of Millbrook held its Regular Council Meeting at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, June 25, 2019, in the City Council Meeting Room.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. Council President Gay gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

CALL TO ORDER. Council President Gay called the meeting to order

ROLL CALL. Council President Gay requested the roll be called. Present were Council President Gay, Councilmembers Venable, Harris, Jones, and Hodge. Also present were Mayor Kelley, Department Heads Williams, M. Harris, B. Harris, Harper, Markley, Davis, Police Chief Johnson, Contract Engineering Stuart Peters, City Attorney Kelly Lee, and City Clerk Anita Weaver.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA. Councilmember Hodge moved to approve the Agenda. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jones and passed unanimously by voice vote.

READING OF MINUTES. Regular Council Meeting June 11, 2019. Councilmember Hodge moved to accept the minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jones and passed unanimously by voice vote.

RESOLUTION 19-42. Bid Solicitation. Creekside Business Park Access Improvements. Resolution 19-42 was read in full. Action on this Resolution was deferred until later in the meeting.

RESOLUTION 19-43. Bid Solicitation. AL Hwy 14 Sewer Extension from Gipson Pump Station. Resolution 19-43 was read in full. Action on this Resolution was deferred until later in the meeting.

SITE DEVELOPMENT PLAN. Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen. Stuart Peters gave a review of the project stating all departments had approved the site plan and it was ready for Council consideration. He also recognized Flowers & White Engineering LLC, Design Engineer Kenneth White Jr. being present representing the request for Popeyes. Councilmember Jones moved to approve the site plan. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Venable and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Council President Gay called for a motion to summarize and consolidate the Public

Assembly Permit requests into one vote. Councilmember Venable moved to summarize and consolidate the public assembly permit requests into one vote. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Hodge and passed unanimously by voice vote.

PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT. Thomas July 4<sup>th</sup> Party; July 4, 2019, 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.; Minnie Massey Park. Request summarized by Council President Gay with the vote deferred until all Public Assembly requests summarized for consolidated vote.

PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT. Singleton Birthday Party; July 20, 2019, 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.; Minnie Massey Park. Request summarized by Council President Gay with the vote deferred until all Public Assembly requests summarized for consolidated vote.

PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT. Lewis Birthday Party; August 17, 2019, 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.; Legacy Park Pavilion. Request summarized by Council President Gay with the vote deferred until all Public Assembly requests summarized for consolidated vote.

Councilmember Hodge moved to approve all of the Public Assembly Permit requests. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jones and passed unanimously by voice vote.

REPORT OF THE MAYOR. Mayor Kelley stated he was glad to see public assembly requests coming through for Minnie Massey Park. He also announced the City is moving forward with plans for a new senior center, and that he appreciated the invitation to have lunch and enjoyed visiting with the Hamilton Place Apartments seniors recently, adding the Elvis impersonator was quite entertaining. On behalf of the City of Millbrook, Mayor Kelley congratulated River Regions Elmore Autauga News co-owner and Editor Sarah Stephens on receiving the Alabama Rural Electric Association of Cooperatives 2019 Media Excellence Award during a recent Millbrook Area Chamber of Commerce event.

REPORTS OF COUNCILMEMBERS. Councilmember Venable commended the City Departments for working so well together, and thanked Chief Johnson for handling some specific complaints in her Ward.

Councilmember Hodge thanked Brandon Harris for the Street Departments successful clean-up day stating there was a long line waiting to take advantage of the service.

Council President Gay announced the Millbrook Community Theatre is starting a two week run of Hello Dolly. He also recognized Central Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission representative Pamela Trammell being present and thanked her for assisting the City in applying for grants.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS. Chief Johnson stated extra officers will be on duty for the July 4<sup>th</sup>

Holiday, and asked for those in need to have designated drivers. He also asked for no firearms to be used shooting in the air during celebrations, and fireworks to stop at a reasonable hour or an officer would be making a visit.

OPEN TO FLOOR. Jean Landingham, as resident of Hamilton Place Apartments asked the Council to consider up to a one cent tax increase to fund public transportation. Mayor Kelley responded that other funding options were being considered.

VOTE ON RESOLUTION 19-42. Councilmember Hodge moved to adopt Resolution 19-42. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Harris and passed unanimously by voice vote.

VOTE ON RESOLUTION 19-43. Councilmember Hodge moved to adopt Resolution 19-43. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jones and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Council President Gay announced the next City Council Meeting will be held July 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. with the work session at 5:30.

ADJOURNMENT. There being no further business, Councilmember Venable moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Harris and passed unanimously by voice vote. The meeting adjourned at 6:17 p.m.
