

MINUTES
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
APRIL 9, 2019

The City of Millbrook held its Regular Council Meeting at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 9, 2019, in the City Council Meeting Room.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. Councilmember Gay gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

CALL TO ORDER. Council President Gay called the meeting to order

ROLL CALL. Council President Gay requested the roll be called. Present were Council President Gay, Councilmembers Venable, Harris, Jones, and Hodge. Also present were Mayor Kelley, Department Heads Williams, M. Harris, Harper, Markley, Davis, Captain Doyle Campbell for Chief Brown, Police Chief Johnson, Contract Engineering Stuart Peters & Jerry Peters, City Attorney Kelly Lee, and City Clerk Anita Weaver.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA. Councilmember Jones moved to approve the Agenda. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Hodge and passed unanimously by voice vote.

READING OF MINUTES. Regular Council Meeting March 26, 2019. Councilmember Jones moved to accept the minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Hodge and passed unanimously by voice vote.

PUBLIC HEARING. Business License Revocation or Refusal of Renewal. Council President Gay opened the Public Hearing. Business License Clerk Brenda Bellizio presented information to the Council regarding Smoke House BBQ, and Dynamic Business Solutions delinquencies. Dynamic Business Solutions owner John Jamison was present and pleaded his case to the Council. Mrs. Bellizio acknowledged Mr. Jamison had recently paid delinquencies and recommended the Council approve Dynamic Business Solutions business license. No one was present to represent Smoke House BBQ due to family health issues and Mrs. Bellizio recommended the Council table the request until the April 23rd meeting. Being no further comments Council President Gay closed the Public Hearing.

BUSINESS LICENSE REVOCATION OR REFUSAL OF RENEWAL. Councilmember Jones moved to approve the business license for Dynamic Business Solutions. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Venable and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Councilmember Hodge moved to table the business license request for Smoke House BBQ until the April 23rd meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Harris and passed unanimously by voice vote.

PERSONNEL. Relatives in the Local Government Service. Consideration of Third Family Member Employee. Tabled 3-26-19. Council President Gay called for a motion to remove from the table. Being no motion was given, no action was taken.

PUBLIC HEARING. For ABC License Request. Council President Gay opened the Public Hearing. He then called for anyone to speak regarding the license request. Applicant James Snider Jr was present and gave a brief review of his request to the Council. Sara Brooks was also present with Mr. Snider but had no comments. Being no further comments, Council President Gay closed the Public Hearing.

ABC LICENSE. Thirst Turtle / 010 – Lounge Retail Liquor – Class I. Councilmember Hodge moved to approve the license request. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jones and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Councilmember Jones moved to summarize and consolidate the public assembly permit requests into one vote. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Hodge and passed unanimously by voice vote.

PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT. New Grace Ministries Church Fall Festival; September 21, 2019, 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.; Village Green Park Stage. Request summarized by Council President Gay with the vote deferred until all Public Assembly requests summarized for consolidated vote.

PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT. Abraham Baptist Church Health Fair & Festival; October 19, 2019, 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.; Village Green Park Stage. Request summarized by Council President Gay with the vote deferred until all Public Assembly requests summarized for consolidated vote.

Councilmember Hodge moved to approve all of the Public Assembly Permit requests. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jones and passed unanimously by voice vote.

REPORT OF THE MAYOR. Mayor Kelley thanked the Department Heads for all the work they do. He also recognized Pamela Trammell representing Central Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission (CARPDC) and thanked her for coming to address the Council.

REPORTS OF COUNCILMEMBERS. Councilmember Jones thanked Stuart Peters and Brandon Harris for their quick responses to recent issues in Ward 4.

Council President Gay conveyed thanks from residents in Magnolia Ridge to Chief Johnson for his department addressing their recent complaints.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS. Chief Johnson reminded everyone of Cops and Kids Day coming up May 11th from 9:00 a.m. till 2:00 p.m. at the Village Green, and thanked all the sponsors for helping make the event happen. He also stated a meeting was held recently with Mayor Kelley, Judge Pool, Kelly Lee, and Tammy Pugh to discuss Bond issues and making crime penalties stronger in Millbrook.

OPEN TO FLOOR. Pamela Trammell with CARPDC announced the City of Millbrook is now eligible to apply for a Block Grant since the last Grant has been completed and closed. She asked the Mayor and Council to consider ideas for potential projects, and a Public Hearing will be held to solicit community ideas as well.

Council President Gay announced the next City Council Meeting will be held April 23rd at 6:00 p.m. with the work session at 5:30.

ADJOURNMENT. There being no further business, Councilmember Venable moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Harris and passed unanimously by voice vote. The meeting adjourned at 6:14 p.m.
